# 59TH UTAH STATE LEGISLATURE

## 2011 VOTING RECORD

*The Utah Education Association tracked numerous bills during the 2011 Legislative Session. This summary highlights several bills that were voted on in the House and/or Senate that could have significant impact on public education and/or the UEA. It is important to note that a voting record is but one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators. It does not explain the reasons a legislator voted a certain way on a bill, and in some cases the final percentage might not accurately reflect a legislator's overall support for public education.*

*From bills affecting general funding, retirement and Association leave, lawmakers considered a wide variety of education-related measures during their 45-day session. In addition to using "final floor votes" on most bills, we have included a few committee votes and votes on important amendments. Often times these votes provide a more critical, or accurate, indication of a legislator's support or lack thereof. ### House of Representatives

#### **HB 2 S2 (Merlynn Newbold)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

#### MINIMUM SCHOOL PROGRAM AND PUBLIC EDUCATION BUDGET AMENDMENTS

***Passed House and Senate***

This bill supplements or reduces appropriations previously provided for school districts, charter schools, and certain state education agencies for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011 and ending June 30, 2012 and modifies related budgetary provisions.

#### **HB 98 (Christine Watkins)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

#### CAPITAL OUTLAY FUNDING MODIFICATIONS

***Passed in House Committee, Passed House and Senate***

This bill expands the permitted uses of proceeds from a capital outlay levy imposed by a local school board.

#### **HB 110 S1 (Marie Poulson)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

#### TEACHER SALARY SUPPLEMENT PROGRAM AMENDMENTS

***Passed in House Committee, Passed House and Senate***

This bill establishes an appeal process for the Teacher Salary Supplement Program. This bill: requires the Department of Human Resource Management to establish and administer an appeal process for a teacher who applies and does not receive the Teacher Salary Supplement; requires a teacher to provide documentation to the department to substantiate an appeal; requires the State Board of Education to provide certain information; and makes technical changes.

#### **HB 152 S1 (Bill Wright)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

#### SCHOOL COMMUNITY COUNCILS AMENDMENTS

***Passed House and Senate, Passed in House and Senate Committees***

This bill modifies provisions pertaining to the membership, selection, and operation of school community councils.

#### **HB 183 S1 (Keith Grover)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

#### SCHOOL DISTRICT LEAVE POLICIES

***Passed House and Senate, Passed in House and Senate Committees***

This bill amends provisions in the State System of Public Education code related to association leave. This bill: prohibits a local school board from granting paid association leave for certain employee association or union duties; for certain school districts, requires reimbursement to a school district of the costs for certain employees, including benefits, for the time that an employee is on: unpaid association leave; or participating in certain paid association leave activities; for certain school districts, provides that the school district may allow up to 10 days of association leave under certain conditions; defines terms; and makes technical changes.

**HB 199 (Jim Bird)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

## ADVERTISEMENT ON SCHOOL BUSES

*Passed in House Committee, Defeated in House/Reconsidered,  
Passed House and Senate*

This bill authorizes the sale of advertising space on a school bus. It allows a local school board or charter school governing board to sell advertising space on the exterior of a school bus; requires a local school board or charter school governing board to adopt guidelines for the type of advertising permitted on a school bus; prohibits certain types of advertising on a school bus; and requires the Department of Transportation to make rules governing the placement and size of an advertisement on a school bus.

**HB 264 S1 (Carol Moss)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBER ELECTION PROCESS  
AMENDMENTS

*Passed in House Committee, Defeated in House*

This bill modifies the election process for membership on the State Board of Education. This bill: defines terms; requires the direct, nonpartisan election of members of the State Board of Education; repeals the involvement of the governor and the nominating and recruiting committee for the State Board of Education in the selection process; moves the election for the State Board of Education to an odd-numbered year; designates a county clerk as the election officer for the election to the State Board of Education; and makes technical corrections.

**HB 301 (Merlynn Newbold)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

## SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPERTY TAX REVISIONS

*Passed in House Committee, Passed House and Senate*

This bill modifies the authority of a school district to impose certain property tax levies. This bill: repeals the authority of a school district to impose certain property tax levies; authorizes a school district to impose a board local levy and a capital local levy; provides that in setting a board local levy or capital local levy for the calendar year beginning on January 1, 2012, a school is exempt from truth in taxation notice and hearing requirements if the school district budgets a certain amount of ad valorem property tax revenue; and makes technical amendments.

**HB 313 (Merlynn Newbold)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

## CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING AMENDMENTS

*Passed in House Committee, Defeated in House*

This bill modifies funding provided to a charter school to replace local discretionary property taxes that are not available to charter schools. \*Phases in over 13 years - property taxes to Charter Schools from school districts.

**HB 388 (Chris Herrod)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

## OPERATION AND MANAGEMENT OF CHARTER SCHOOLS

*Passed in House Committee, Passed House and Senate*

This bill imposes requirements pertaining to the operation and management of charter schools. This bill: provides that a chartering entity may use certain data to measure the performance of a charter school; prohibits a chartering entity from imposing performance standards that would limit a charter school from accomplishing the purposes of charter schools; requires a charter to include an acknowledgment that neither the chartering entity nor the state is liable for the debts or financial obligations of the charter school; and makes technical changes.

**HB 447 (Johnny Anderson)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

## KINDERGARTEN LITERACY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

*Passed in House Committee, Defeated in House*

This bill establishes a computer-based kindergarten literacy program.

#### **HJR 1 (Carl Wimmer)**

JOINT RESOLUTION AMENDING STATE AND LOCAL TAXING

*Defeated in House Committee*

This joint resolution of the Legislature proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to modify requirements for increasing a state or local tax or fee.

#### **HJR 37 (Carl Wimmer)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

JOINT RESOLUTION ON STATE SPENDING LIMITATIONS

*Passed in House Committee, Not Heard in House*

This joint resolution of the Legislature proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to modify a provision of the Revenue and Taxation Article relating to state expenditures.

### Senate

#### **SB 59 S1 (Wayne Niederhauser)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

SCHOOL GRADING SYSTEM

*Passed in Senate Committee, Passed House and Senate*

This bill establishes a school grading system based on the performance of a school's students on statewide assessments, and for high schools, the graduation rate and measures that indicate college and career readiness.

#### **SB 65 S1 (Howard Stephenson)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

STATEWIDE ONLINE EDUCATION PROGRAM

*Passed in Senate Committee, Passed House and Senate*

This bill creates the Statewide Online Education Program to enable a student to earn high school graduation credit through the completion of online courses.

#### **SB 73 S1 (Howard Stephenson)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHER TENURE MODIFICATIONS

*Passed in Senate Committee, Passed House and Senate*

This bill amends the Utah Orderly School Termination Procedures Act to prohibit a school district from using certain termination policies.

#### **SB 127 (Dan Liljenquist)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

POST RETIREMENT EMPLOYMENT AMENDMENTS

*Passed House and Senate, Passed in House and Senate Committees*

This bill modifies the Utah State Retirement and Insurance Benefit Act by amending provisions related to a retiree who returns to work for a participating employer.

#### **SB 179 S1 (Howard Stephenson)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

MATH EDUCATION INITIATIVE

*Passed in Senate Committee, Passed Senate, Defeated in House*

This bill creates a program that awards grants for the improvement of math education.

#### **SB 224 (Howard Stephenson)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

PARTISAN SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS

*Passed in Senate Committee, Passed Senate, Not Heard in House*

This bill modifies the Election Code by amending provisions related to the election of the State Board of Education members.

#### **SB 256 S2 (Stuart Adams)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

TEACHER EFFECTIVENESS EVALUATION PROCESS

*Passed in Senate Committee, Passed House and Senate*

This bill modifies provisions related to teacher career ladders and educator evaluations.

#### **SJR 1 (Chris Butters)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This joint resolution of the Legislature proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to modify a provision relating to the State Board of Education. **Highlighted Provisions:** This resolution proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to: specify that the State Board of Education's general control and supervision of the public education system is as provided by statute.

JOINT RESOLUTION ON STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AUTHORITY

***Passed in Senate Committee, Defeated in Senate***

#### **SJR 9 (Stuart Reid)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This resolution proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to: move the general control and supervision of the public education system from the State Board of Education to the Governor, as provided by statute, and make conforming changes; and provide that the Governor has general control and supervision of the higher education system, as provided by statute.
