UEA 2017 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORD SUMMARY

The Utah Education Association tracked numerous bills during the 2017 legislative session. This summary highlights several bills dealing directly or indirectly with education that were voted on by the Legislature that could have a significant impact on public education and/or the UEA. It is important to note that a voting record is but one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators.

From bills affecting public education funding, grading schools and school turnaround to teacher recruitment and retention, lawmakers considered a wide variety of education-related measures during their 45-day session. In addition to using floor votes on bills, we have included a few committee votes as well. Often these votes provide a more accurate indication of a legislator's support or lack thereof. The UEA encourages you to contact your legislators directly to ask them to explain their votes. HOUSE BILLS

- HB 62 (Keven Stratton)** EDUCATOR RIGHTS AMENDMENTS
UEA's Position: Support *Passed in the House and Senate*
HB 62 requires districts to adopt a definition of abusive conduct by students and parents toward school employees.
- HB 105 (Craig Hall)** EARLY VOTING AMENDMENTS
UEA's Position: Support *Passed in the House and Senate*
HB 105 permits an election officer to extend the last day of the early voting period to the day before the election date.
- HB 136 (Mike Kennedy)** BOARD OF EDUCATION REVISIONS
UEA's Position: Oppose *Passed in the House and Senate*
HB 136 requires the State Board of Education to take certain actions before implementing a federal program that does not directly and simultaneously advance a state goal, objective, program need or accountability system.
- HB 168 (Lowry Snow)** KINDERGARTEN SUPPLEMENTAL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM
UEA's Position: Support w/comment *Passed in the House and Senate*
HB 168 provides extended-day kindergarten programs for high poverty schools with funding from Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).
- HB 212 (Mike Winder)** INCENTIVE FOR EFFECTIVE TEACHERS IN HIGH POVERTY SCHOOLS
UEA's Position: Oppose *Passed in the House and Senate*
HB 212 provides a bonus in a few high-poverty schools to teachers who are deemed effective based on student test scores.
- HB 241 (Marie Poulson)** SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILITY AND ASSESSMENT AMENDMENTS
UEA's Position: Support *Passed in the House; Tabled in the Senate*
HB 241 would improve the school accountability system by reporting a dashboard of school indicators and requiring ACT assessment for high school. It would also eliminate letter grades for schools.
- HB 352 (Ken Ivory)** PUBLIC EDUCATION EMPLOYMENT REVISIONS
UEA's Position: Oppose *Failed in House Education Committee*
HB 352 amends several provisions related to school employees and volunteers.
